WHAT DO THESE JOB TITLES MEAN?

OSTLER	-	a man who looked after customers horses at an inn
FARRIER	-	a smith who shod horses
MILLINER	-	a person who made or sold women's hats
CHANDLER	-	a person who made and sold candles
CORDWAINER	-	a person who made things out of leather
WAINWRIGHT	-	somebody who built wagons
